VEHICLE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Peter and Doris have had many years of experience in the catering industry, specifically through the ownership and running of a coffee shop-style bistro. They have had to give up this career in order to take care of the needs of their severely disabled daughter. Their experience with the welfare system through these difficult times made them realise that there was a large gap in the system that many unfortunate people would slip through.

After years of deliberation and soul-searching, Peter and Doris were moved to try and do something to help. Little Doris Charity was the result of this journey. Its mission, as already stated, is to help the disadvantaged. The main difference, however, between it and many other charities helping the same demographic is the objective. It is not just to ask for charitable donations to be redistributed. It is instead to create an organisation based around a commercial enterprise to ensure a minimum of state assistance, which will provide a road map for individuals to become fully functioning and productive. This will be achieved through training and short-term employment contracts to facilitate their transition into full-time employment.

STRUCTURE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Little Doris Company will have four distinctive yet integrated parts to its structure. These can potentially all be housed in one building or split across several in different locations. The functions of each will be indicated in the following pages.

The four parts will include:

- 2. Noah's Ark
- 3. Factory Kitchen
- 4. Hostel

RECEPTION / DROP-IN CENTRE

This area would be a casual drop-in community centre, open to all. It would be run by a duty officer, part-time staff and volunteers subject to demand. It would consist of a lounge area with an informal library facility and television, as well as a recreation area with table tennis, billiards and board games available. Additionally, there would be a formal office area and a couple of private interview/meeting rooms for councilling and registration purposes.

The reception would be the first contact point for The Ark for most candidates: it would also act as an information hub to enable visitors to be directed to the right local government departments and other local social services for help as required. Additionally, it will act as a selection centre for those looking for training work and temporary accommodation within The Ark.

NOAH'S ARK

Noah's Ark would be a fully functioning catering facility offering light lunches and beverages, operating on a commercial basis to generate revenue for the whole charity. 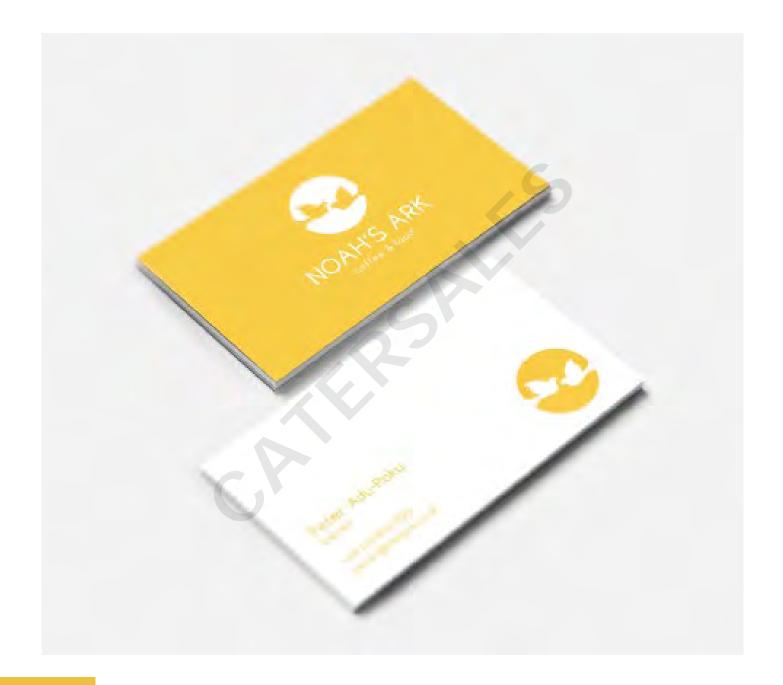
All colours and materials are chosen to create an uplifting and inspiring atmosphere. The scheme should also communicate sustainable and ethical standards.

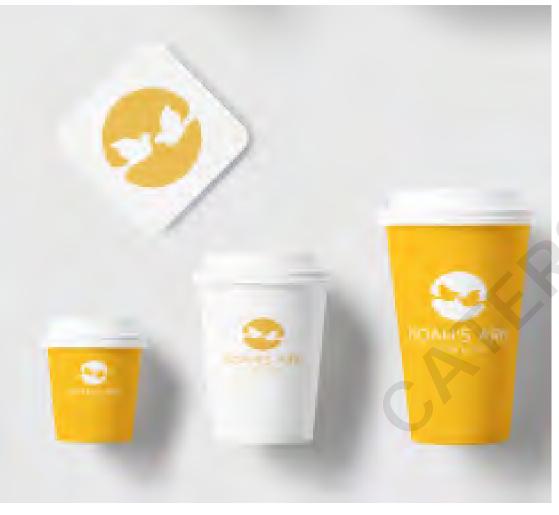






























FACTORY KITCHEN

This will be a fully functioning commercial kitchen with production and storage facilities. There would also be a number of classrooms with basic equipment dedicated to initial training and recipe development.

Its primary function will be to act as a training facility to offer experience and training to candidates who wish to start a career in catering thereby giving them a spring board to employment in the industry. Its secondary role will be to provide food for Noah's Ark which will be sold and consumed at its branches.

Candidates will have the opportunity once trained to move to Noah's Ark for further service training in a fully-functioning commercial environment.

Candidates will also be offered the opportunity subject to skills and attainment to ultimately take a franchise of Noah's Ark and start their own business.

HOSTEL

The hostel would be attached to the factory or dropin centre, and would consist of a minimum of twenty beds with shared facilities to help the homeless and desperate with short-term accomodation in order that they can have some respite from their circumstances.

This would offer a safety net for short-term stays only for candidates who are actively involved in Noah's Ark and the training facility, as well as an overnight shelter for the needy.
